

British Values:

We will be focussing on Individual's rights and responsibilities as well as respecting peoples' beliefs and customs from multiple cultures. This will tie in with The Battle of Hastings.

P.E:

We will be working on the topic of Gymnastics. The focus will be on the way we move, stretch and balance. There are many aspects to the Gymnastics topic, which will see the children work both collaboratively and independently; both with and without apparatus.

Weather permitting, we will take the opportunity to use the wider space, such as the gym trail and field for some of our free-flowing movements.

Science:

We will be looking at 'Evolution and Inheritance' as well as covering off the 'Water cycle', linked with our Geography work and topic of Water-world.

R.E:

We will be looking at 'Salvation' as part of our Christian Distinctiveness, This will include using theological terms to explain the connections between the biblical texts and key concepts, which we will be studying.

Art:

We will be using clay for sculpturing; to replicate cliffs and waterways. We will be painting and decorating these, in order to make them as realistic as possible, including appropriate vegetation and settlements.

Computing:

We will be learning a new song, which we will study in order to recognise: pitch, tone and rhythm and the importance of these features in determining the music that we listen to.

P.S.H.C.E:

We will be continuing to look at the Terling Church of England, School Values and will be focusing on the value of : Trust.

Geography:

We will describe and understand key aspects of the World's physical geography, including: climate zones, biomes and vegetation belts, rivers, mountains, volcanoes and earthquakes, and the water cycle

Maths:

English:

This half term we continue to look at classic poems, which will lead us in to our next area of study, which will be recounts. The focus will be on non-fiction texts and these will largely be based around the continent of Africa, Oceans, Seas and lakes.

Grammar and Punctuation:

We will be looking at numerous language features as well as focusing on conjunctions, subordinating conjunctions and relative and subordinating clauses.
