Meet the Governors: Sept 2017-July 2018

We have received resignations from the following Governors: Jeanne MacWillson (with immediate effect), Richard Sargeant and Janice Ovenden (with effect from the end of the summer term). We thank Jeanne, Richard and Janice their contribution as Governors and commitment to the school during their tenure.

As Chair of Governors I gave notice last November that, after 8 years of service, I would not be renewing my term of office when it expired in March. Following the Headteacher's absence in the Spring Term and the Ofsted inspection, I committed to stay on until the end of the Summer Term to help strategically by continuing to work alongside Sarah Meares, the Local Authority and Diocese in order to secure external support for the Leadership team and delivering the Ofsted priorities at pace. We have undertaken a full review of Governance and I have equipped the Governing Body with a toolkit to help better track and record their impact. We have also secured the services of a 'National Leader in Education' to support the school as an Executive Headteacher and a 'National Leader in Governance' to provide training and mentoring to Governors as necessary.

He has worked in Information Technology for over 25 years and is the Technical Director of a small, local IT Consultancy firm. Annette was appointed as a Foundation Governor at the beginning of the Summer Term and has lived in Terling for 7 years. She is a regular attendant of All Saints Church and sits on the Parochial Church Council. Attendance at Meetings – September 2018 – July 2019

There are three Committees that meet as a minimum of once per term (or more as required), namely the Pupil & Curriculum Committee, the Personnel Committee and the Finance and Premises Committee. We also convene a Pay Committee in accordance with the school's Performance Management process. Each of these Committees then feeds into the main Full Governing Body meeting that also meets on a termly basis. Working Party meetings to deal with strategic projects are arranged as and when required. Since Ofsted we have established a voluntary 'Improvement Board' with Membership comprising Sarah Meares, Claire Franklin, Kelly Hodkinson, the Local Authority and the Diocese. Updates are sent to all Governors and Parents after each meeting.

2018/2019 Academic Year

It is our duty to work with the Head Teacher and the Staff to provide the best possible educational opportunities for the pupils. It was agreed that Governor monitoring for the 2018/18 Academic Year would be aligned with the School's priorities as defined on the School Development Plan. After the Ofsted inspection a 'Raising Achievement Plan' (RAP) was developed in conjunction with the Local Authority which superceded the School Development Plan. As a result all Governing Monitoring visits were realigned against monitoring and delivering the RAP priorities as identified on Ofsted page 2.

A schedule of visits was implemented which saw each Governor visit school each term to monitor their areas of responsibility. The Governors complete 'Visit Feedback Reports' following each of their visits and clearly evidence and articulate the impact of their visits along with any outstanding questions and ideas for future visits. The areas of responsibility are as follows:

EYFS outside learning; Writing; Reading; Mathematics; Science; Health & Safety/Maintenance; SEND; Quality of teaching; Wider Curriculum; Financial Checks; Data; Child Protection; Safeguarding; Pupil and Sport Premium; Attendance; RE; Computing; Website; Behaviour; Supporting Pupils with Medical Conditions; Staff Wellbeing; Parent Survey; Performance Management and Target setting.

The key focus for the Governing Body is:

- Ensuring that all teaching is at least good and in most cases teachers are making rapid progress towards outstanding.
- Ensuring the delivery of a rich curriculum, containing meaningful, learning experiences with consistency in the approach to the teaching and learning of Reading, Writing and Mathematics
- To embed pastoral care systems across the school
- To ensure that high expectations of learning and behaviour are met through consistency in practice

The Governors have also undergone Safeguarding Training and ASP data training and participated in training courses/attended conferences specific to their individual needs in conjunction with the committees on which they serve.

2019/2020 Academic Year

During the next Academic Year we are planning to review our meetings structure to ensure that all Governors have a consistent level of knowledge across all subject areas.

In terms of our strategic priorities, we would like to embed our new team; deliver the Ofsted priorities and achieve at least 'good' on our next Ofsted inspection.
